 - Implemented a community-oriented policing philosophy throughout the entire police operation. Increased participation in Neighborhood Crime Watch from 3 organizations to 29 organizations.
 - Secured several sources of grant funding to enhance law enforcement operations; Public Housing Drug Elimination Program (HUD), COPS / FAST, and Neighborhood Initiative Program.
 - Opened three community substations in the city. These community substations are staffed by citizen volunteers who have received appropriate training. There are currently 38 citizens who regularly volunteer time to man the stations.
 - Implemented the first "Citizen Observer Patrol" (COP) in the Broward Sheriff's Office. Ninety seven (97) citizens have received training and regularly patrol their neighborhoods working hand in hand with their police officers.

Promoted to rank of Captain in December 1987 and assigned as the Deputy Director of the Department of Organized Crime; 107 employees (84 sworn personnel, 23 civilian personnel) with a \$5.6 million annual budget.

MAJOR AL LAMBERTI BROWARD COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE

Major Al Lamberti is a twenty-nine year veteran of the Broward County Sheriff's Office. He is currently a Regional Director in the Patrol Services Bureau of the Department of Law Enforcement.

He served as the Interim Chief of Police for the City of North Lauderdale from November 2000 until it's merger with the Broward County Sheriff's Office in October 2001. He returned to the Department of Law Enforcement and assumed command of the South Patrol Region which includes Port Everglades and Fort Lauderdale/Hollywood International Airport post-September 11th.

He previously served as the Director of the Training and Organizational Development Division where he oversaw the Center for Advanced Criminal Justice Studies Executive Leadership Program as well as all day-to-day training functions.

He also served as the Assistant Director of the Bureau of Countywide Services, which encompassed Criminal Investigations, Special Operations and Child Protective Investigations. He served as the Interim Chief of Police for the City of Hollywood from November 1998 to August 1999 and was the District Chief of District 10 (*Deerfield Beach District*), a post he assumed in January 1990 until his promotion to Major in May 1998.

Major Lamberti began his career with the Broward County Sheriff's Office in 1977. He started his career as a detention deputy at the Broward County Jail. He worked his way through the ranks as a road patrol deputy in the North Broward and Lauderdale Lakes districts as a road patrol sergeant and then a sergeant, lieutenant and captain in the Organized Crime Division. He then assumed his position as District Chief in Deerfield Beach in January 1990.

Major Lamberti was previously assigned as the Deputy Director of the Organized Crime Division, serving there from 1984 until 1990. During his career in the Organized Crime Division, he supervised the Narcotics Conspiracy Section, the Air/Marine Interdiction Unit, Major Case/RICO, Colombian Organized Crime Task Force, Jamaican Gang Task Force, White Collar Crime Unit and the Racketeering/Intelligence Section.

Major Lamberti was the Chairman of the Regional Coordinating Team of the Florida Violent Crime and Drug Control Council for the Southeast Region from 1999 to 2007.

Major Lamberti is a graduate of the F.B.I. National Academy, Quantico, Virginia. He attended the 167th Session from September-December 1991. He is the Past President of the Florida Chapter of the FBI National Academy Associates (2004).

Major Lamberti attended Florida State University for two years (1972-1974).
