

Prescott L. Prince was graduated from Washington and Lee Law School in 1983 and was admitted to the Virginia State Bar the same year. He was awarded his Bachelor of Arts Degree from Davidson College in 1976 and he earned a Master of Arts Degree in Psychology (emphasis in clinical) from Radford University in 1980.

Upon being admitted to the Bar, Mr. Prince commenced service as an active duty Judge Advocate with the United States Navy.
